#### From the Desk of the CEO

#### **July Council Meeting**

Items from the July Council Meeting include,

#### **Murchison Regional Vermin Council.**

The Murchison Regional Vermin Council (MRVC) has been exploring alternative governance structures to simplify their operations. The MRVC currently operates as a Regional Council which binds them under the *Local Government Act 1995* and imposes the same regulation and financial reporting obligations on them as a local government.

Over the last couple of years, the MRVC have looked at different governance structures. One option to merge with the Meekatharra Rangelands Biosecurity Association and be governed under the *Associations Incorporations Act 2015*. The second option is to become a Regional Subsidiary under the *Local Government Act 1995* and be governed by the *Local Government (Regional Subsidiaries) Regulations 2017*.

#### 2023/2024 Annual Budget

The annual budget was adopted by Council at this meeting, which means that you will shortly be receiving your 2023/2024 Rates Notice.

Don't forget that to receive your **discount**, payment must be received in full within 14 days of issue of rates notice.

#### What is it?

Anybody driving around town may have noticed the activity around the Water Tanks. What's happening, well stay tuned and focused on the tanks and you will see them transformed before your eyes.

#### **Bin Stickers**

The Visitors Centre staff recently spoke to me about bin Stickers and the availability of these through Keep Australia Beautiful.

One idea was to have our tourist landmarks placed on bins around town. Depending on cost we would like several different stickers made.

#### Who can enrol and vote?

It is compulsory for all eligible Australian citizens over 18 years to enrol to vote. You are eligible to enrol and vote if you:

- are an Australian citizen, or a British subject who was enrolled on 25 January 1984\*
- are 18 years or older, and
- have lived at your address for at least one month.

\*For Western Australian electors only, you are eligible to enrol and vote if you were a British subject enrolled between 26 October 1983 and 25 January 1984 inclusive.

You can enrol at 16 years for federal purposes but cannot vote until you are 18. For Western Australian electors the minimum age for enrolment is 17.

Within three weeks of receiving your enrolment form the AEC will confirm your enrolment. We may seek further information from you and confirm your enrolment using any of the contact details you provide.

#### Special enrolment

Special category enrolment forms are available if you:

- are temporarily overseas
- cannot attend a polling place on election day
- believe that having your address shown on a publicly available roll may endanger your safety or that of your family
- have no fixed address
- are in prison
- are physically incapable of signing your name
- are working in Antarctica.

Following the historical walk, our fantastic State ICPA Secretary Louise Ford along with Tallaya Wood from the Goldfields Eyre Branch presented information to give parents an understanding as to the work the ICPA does for equity of access to education for all students who live in rural and remote Australia.



# Perseids Meteor Shower 12th and 13th August

The further north you are in WA, the better it is for this meteor shower.

This month, stargazers will be treated to a special display from the Perseids Meteor Shower. On a dark night, away from artificial light pollution, you might see up to 60 meteors (or "shooting stars") an hour!

The Perseids meteor shower is generated from comet Swift-Tutle and renowned for producing bright meteors. The shower **peaks on the night of the 12th/13th of August but can be viewed several days either side of the peak**. The best views will be under dark skies, after midnight.

This shower emanates from the constellation Perseus, which is not visible to the south western regions of WA. Those in northern WA might be high enough to make the most out of the shower.

When to look: From midnight to early morning, 12th/13th August

Which direction to look: Low on the northern horizon

#### Do I Need a Telescope to see a Meteor Shower?

You don't need a telescope or binoculars to see a meteor shower. It's a great time to gather with friends, roll out your favourite picnic rug, pack the drinks and snacks, and start counting how many "shooting stars" you all see!

It's best to view a meteor shower under a dark night sky. Most meteors will be quite faint so darker surroundings will make it easier to see them. You might consider heading out to a dark sky location at one of WA's Astrotourism Towns. If you're an astrophotographer, it is an excellent opportunity to image meteors over some of WA's iconic landscapes. Where are WA's Astrotourism Towns? Fingers crossed for a spectacular show!

# Egg Stuffed Roasted Mushrooms

#### **Ingredients:**

- 2 Large field or portobello mushrooms
- 2 cloves garlic crushed
- 4 fresh thyme sprigs
- Olive oil cooking spray
- 2 eggs
- 2 cherry tomatoes, halved
- A handful of baby rocket leaves
- 2 slices of rye bread, toasted

#### Method:

- Preheat the oven to 200C and line a tray with baking paper.
- Sprinkle a little bit of crushed garlic over each mushroom and place them on the baking tray.
- Top the mushrooms with thyme and pepper. Lightly spray with olive oil and bake for 10 minutes.
- Crack an egg into each mushroom and place halved cherry tomatoes next to the mushrooms.
- Bake another 10 minutes or until egg whites are set.
- Serve mushrooms and tomatoes with fresh rocket leaves and a slice of toast.

This is a low carb and protein rich breakfast, great for a day on the move!




