Western Australias Christmas tree! (Nuytsia floribunda)

The WA Christmas tree is very unusual. It has no relatives and is classed in a genus by itself in the mistletoe family. Unlike other mistletoes that grow on the branches of their host trees, the WA Christmas tree grows in the ground. It is partially parasitic which means that its roots make rings round the roots of nearby plants and then extracts water and nutrients from those plants.

The WA Christmas Tree is the only plant in the mistletoe family that has seeds that are wind dispersed. The seeds have wings on them but because the seeds are quite large they often land just a few metres from the parent tree. The majority of seeds are eaten by ants and other creatures, or they are not able to germinate due to the circumstances not being ideal for germination.

During the flowering period which is now, the flowers are a rich source of nectar for the nectar eating birds and insects for the insect eating birds.

The trees develop thick trunks which are made from a starchy tissue which horses love to eat and they continue to chew until they kill the tree. It is important that large numbers of animals are not allowed to stand under these trees, or any trees for that matter, for shade. The compaction of the ground by the hooves of livestock, particularly cattle and horses, can slowly kill a tree.

The weight of the flowers and leaves of the WA Christmas Tree often causes branches to break off the trees which gives them an irregular, often battered, look.

We do not fully understand the WA Christmas Tree and how to give it the best chance of survival when planted into a garden or a bushland setting. In their natural setting they appear to be tough and adapta-

ble. They can be seen growing over a large area from Kalbarrie to Iraelite Bay which includes many different soil types and situations.

In reality nobody knows how to help them to grow successfully in gardens or bushland.

For every one person who succeeds to grow a WA Christmas Tree there are at least another five who fail.





December Stargazing



On Christmas Eve, the two brightest planets we see in the night sky will be on opposite sides of the evening sky, at about the same height above the horizon. Jupiter will be on the north east horizon and Venus on the western horizon.

Take some time out under the stars to relax before a busy Christmas Day.

When and where to look:

8pm, 24th December. North east and west.

Something Interesting

Do you wonder if there is an astronomical explanation for the Star of Bethlehem? There are a few theories – perhaps it was a comet, a supernova or perhaps a planetary conjunction (or close grouping of planets)

One hypothesis is that the Star of Bethlehem was a conjunction of Venus and Jupiter on 17th June in the year 2 BC. The planets were very close to each other above the north western horizon on this date. Now they are on opposite sides of the sky!



Orion the Hunter is a famous summer constellation, and it is up in the early evening for you to see now. First thing in the evening, look directly to the east. The brightest star you'll see is Sirius.

Directly to the left of Sirius is what is often referred to as 'the Saucepan', and it's part of the Orion constellation. There are three bright stars in a reasonably straight line that make up the base of the saucepan, and a handle sticks out at the top right.

Orion has been known since ancient times. In Greek mythology, Orion is a mighty hunter, but his image is upside down in the southern hemisphere. The three bright stars of the base are Orion's belt, and the saucepan handle forms Orion's sword.

With lovely summer evenings ahead, take an opportunity to marvel at the incredible constellation of Orion.

Astronomer and author Ray Norris <u>says</u> "There are many stories about the Orion constellation right across Australia, and they are nearly always about a group of men hunting or fishing.

According to Norris, the Yolngu people in Arnhem Land tell a story of the three brothers in a canoe in the Orion constellation, better known as *Djulpan*.

The three stars in Orion's belt are the brothers sitting side by side, with the stars Betelgeuse and Rigel marking the front and back of the canoe. The stars in Orion's nebula represent a fish, and the stars of Orion's sword mark out a fishing line trailing behind the canoe. "I love it because it actually looks like a canoe when you see it," says Norris.

When to look: Early to late evening Which direction to look: East



What happens during solstice?

The December Solstice, also known as the summer solstice, marks the marks the day with the most number of daylight hours in the southern hemisphere. The Sun appears at its highest point in the sky, with the Earth most tilted towards the Sun. But it isn't the latest sunset or the earliest sunrise: this is because of the Earth's orbit around the Sun is an ellipse, and because the Earth is offcentre on its axis. Together, these factors mean a difference of several minutes difference between solar and mean time. The word "solstice" comes from the Latin sol (sun) and sistere (to stand still), because the Sun was believed to stop moving, before changing direction.

When is the solstice this year?

The summer solstice for the southern hemisphere will occur on 21st December at 5:20 pm.



If you've think Jupiter looks really bright lately, that's because it has reached what's known as "opposition". "Opposition" is a word that astronomers use to describe the time when a planet is on the opposite side of Earth to the Sun. It means that the planet is as close as it gets to Earth for the year which makes for great viewing.

When and where to look:

From 9pm right through the month of December in the north east and north.

Mosquito Treatment (Sandstone residents)

If you haven't already picked up some Sumilarv sachets from the shire office there are still plenty to go around. Simply pop into the office to pick some up.

Sumilary is a slow release granular for the control of mosquitos in non-natural water sources braking the breeding cycle.

The Shire has treated the nearby evaporation pond and will continue to do other treatments such as fogging when able.

Waste oil (Sandstone residents)

There is a waste oil disposal facility in the shire works depot for residential quantities—this is free of charge. Contact the shire for more information.



White Christmas

Ingredients

- 250g Copha
- 3 cups Kellogg's Rice Bubbles
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- 3/4 cup icing sugar, sifted
- 1 cup powdered milk
- 1 cup packaged, dried mixed fruit
- Glace cherries for topping
- 1. Combine dry ingredients in a mixing bowl
- 2. Melt Copha slowly over low heat. Cool slightly, pour onto dry ingredients. Mix well
- 3. Working quickly, spoon into paper patty cases or press into a lamington tin
- 4. Freeze until set (about 15 minutes), then store in the refrigerator
- 5. Cut into fingers, top with glace cherries and serve.

Stained glass cookies

Ingredients:

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp kosher salt
- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 tbsp milk
- 1/2 tsp almond extract
- Hard candies such as jolly ranchers



- 1. In a large bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, and salt.
- 2. In another large bowl using a hand mixer, beat butter and sugar until creamy. Add egg, milk, and almond extract and beat to combine. Add dry ingredients and beat until fully incorporated.
- 3. Divide dough in half and shape each into a disk and wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate until firm, at least 2 hours and up to 3 days.
- 4. Sort jolly ranchers by color and use a rolling pin or meat tenderizer to crush into small pieces, keeping the colors separated.
- 5. Line two large baking sheets with parchment. Working one disk at a time, roll dough out on a lightly floured surface to 1/4" thick. Cut shapes out with large cookie cutters, then cut the centers out with a small cookie cutter of the same shape. Place on prepared baking sheets.
- 6. Fill the centers about ¾ full with crushed jolly ranchers. Refrigerate until chilled, at least 30 minutes.
- 7. Preheat oven to 350°F. Bake cookies until edges are lightly golden, 8 to 10 minutes. Let cool completely before removing from baking sheets.

The awards day was very enjoyable and we got lots of ideas from around the state.


Thank you to everyone involved this year.



What's Priority Assistance?

Priority Assistance is a priority fault repair and connection service we offer customers who depend on a working home phone due to a life-threatening medical condition. If you or someone living with you may be at risk without access to a working home phone, you could be eligible for Priority Assistance. Read our <u>Priority Assistance Policy (PDF, 135KB)</u> for more information.

Who's eligible?

If you or someone who's living at the same address has a diagnosed lifethreatening medical condition and relies on a fixed home phone service you may be eligible for Priority Assistance.

If you're not a current Telstra account holder, you'll need to order a new home phone service to receive Priority Assistance. Call us on 13 22 00 and say 'Priority Assistance' to place your order.

Examples of eligible medical conditions or circumstances include:

- At high risk of respiratory emergencies
- At high risk of cardiovascular emergencies
- At risk of life-threatening hypoglycaemia or epilepsy
- At high risk of obstetric and neonatal emergencies
- At high-risk with mental health disorders
- Technology-dependent who are at high risk.

You're also eligible for Priority Assistance if you have other dependent medical conditions and live alone without support or in a remote location.






