Valentine's Day, a dark beginning

The origin of Valentine's Day cannot be exactly pinpointed, but one place to start is ancient Rome.

From February 13th to 15th, a feast called Lupercialia was celebrated. During this time, men would sacrifice a goat and a dog and then whip women with the hides of the sacrificed animals. Believe it or not, but young women would line up for this as they believed it would make them fertile.

The festival also included a matchmaking lottery where young men drew a woman's name out of a jar. The couple would then "connect" for the duration of the festival or longer if it was a good match.

The name Valentine is believed to come from two executed men, both named Valentine.

One refused to worship the Roman gods and was prosecuted. While in prison, a letter was written signed "from your Valentine" to a woman he allegedly healed from blindness. It is said that the holiday could be inspired by his kindness.

Around the same time, Roman soldiers were secretly married by a priest named St Valentine of Terni. This was against the orders of Emperor Gothicus who believed unmarried men were better soldiers. He executed St Valentine on 14th of February around 269AD.

The Catholic church honored their martyrdom with the celebration of St Valentine's Day.

Pope Gelasius I combined St Valentine's Day with Lupercalia in the fifth century to do away with the pagan ritual. It became more of a theatrical interpretation of the pagan ritual, and it still was a day of fertility and love.

Around about the same time, Galatin's (lover of women) day was celebrated by the Normans. This day was likely confused with St Valentin's Day in part because they sounded alike.

Chaucer and Shakespeare romanticized Valentine's Day in their work, making it gain popularity throughout Britain and Europe. With this also came the handmade paper cards as Valentine's Day tokens.

Cards became factory-made in the 19th century and in 1913, valentines cards were mass-produced by Hallmark cards of Kansas City, Mo.

Why red roses?

Red roses were tied to Aphrodite (Venus), the Goddess of Love.

Greek mythology tells of rose bushes growing from the ground through Aphrodite's tears and the blood of her lover, Adonis.

One of the reasons twelve roses are given on Valentine's Day, is to show the person you love that you love them 12 months a year.

And finally, where did the heart shaped box of chocolates come from? Well, the first heart shaped box of chocolates was a marketing idea from Richard Cadbury. So sadly, not created by a hopeless romantic, it was just a very successful marketing scheme.

Love Stories through the Ages

Aphrodite and Adonis

Aphrodite fell in love with Adonis the day he was born and wanted him for herself, no matter what. She put him in a box and gave the box to Persephone, Goddess of the Underworld, for safekeeping. Persephone however was curious and opened the box. This resulted in her also falling in love with Adonis and also wanting to keep him for herself.

This lead to a dispute between Aphrodite and Persephone which Zeus ended by deciding that Adonis has to stay one third of the year with Aphrodite and one third with Persephone. He could do whatever he pleased with the other third of the year and decided to spend that time with Aphrodite.

It is mentioned that a third goddess, Artemis, the Goddess of Hunting, became jealous of the love between Adonis and Aphrodite and tried to kill him several times without success due to the intervention of the God Poseidon, God of the sea, storms, earthquakes and horses.

Adonis did eventually get killed and there are two separate myths of his demise.

One of them tells the story of Adonis being killed by a boar which was the god Ares (God of War) in disguise. He was the lover of Aphrodite.

The second one states that Artemis was jealous of Adonis' hunting skills and sent a boar which eventually killed him in one of this hunting expeditions.

In both stories, Adonis bled to death in Aphrodite's arms.

Orpheus and Eurydice

Orpheus had recently married Eurydice but on the day of their wedding, Eurydice got bitten by a viper and soon died from the venom.

Orpheus was so distraught with grief that he descended into the underworld to plea for the return of his beloved to the world of the living. Being in the underworld, he melted the hearts of both Hades



(God of the Underworld) and his wife Proserpine*, who was sympathetic to his cause, remembering her own forceful abduction by Hades. It is said that even Cerberus, the three-headed dog guarding the gates of Hell, lied meekly at Proserpine's feet.

Permission was given for Eurydice to return to the living on one condition, that Orpheus does not glance back at her until she is safely returned to the upper world. On leaving the underworld, they both ascended a steep and misty path and as they approached the earth's rim, Orpheus looked behind him to see his bride. She immediately fell and murmured a final farewell before dying again, never to leave the underworld but knowing that Orpheus loved her unconditionally.

*Proserpine: Daughter of Zeus (Chief God) and Demeter (Goddess of Agriculture). Hades fell madly in love with her and kidnapped her to become his Queen of the Underworld.

Abelard and Heloise

This story began in 1115, when Abelard met Heloise, who was living with her uncle at the time. She would have been in her early twenties and was known to be a brilliant scholar, well-versed in Latin, Greek and Hebrew. Abelard was a 37-year-old and in his prime as a teacher of philosophy and theology.

Abelard decided to seduce her and offered her uncle to tutor her. The affair ended in Heloise getting pregnant to which Abelard had her sent to his family home in Brittany where she gave birth to a son named Astrolabe.

After having married her in secret, Abelard had her sent to a convent to protect her. Soon after this happened, her uncle organised a band of men who broke into Abelard's room and, long story short, made sure he would never father any children again. As a result, Abelard decided to become a monk and persuaded Heloise to also enter religious life.

The story and what followed is known from Abelard's autobiographical writings, the Historia Calamitatum, seven letters written between Abelard and Heloise, and four letters written between Peter the Venerable and Heloise. There is also a collection of "lost love letters" which has been argued to be fragments of the illicit correspondence between Abelard and Heloise during the winter of 1115-16.

Pyramus and Thysbe

Ever wondered why the mulberry is black? Neither have I, but here is the story anyway.

This one is a Babylonian love story where Pyramus and Thysbe were only able to communicate with each other through a crack in the wall between their houses because their parents did not approve of their union. And who can deny true love if it is meant to be? So the lovers fled and agreed to meet under a mulberry tree.

Thysbe, who arrived first, got terrified by the roar of a lioness and took flight, dropping her veil in the process. The lioness ripped the veil into pieces and stained it with blood, blood that was left on her jaws from an ox she had killed earlier.

When Poor Pyramus arrived afterwards, he believed that she was devoured by the lioness and stabbed himself. When Thysbe returned, she found him mortally wounded under a mulberry tree and put an end to her own life. From that time forward, the fruit of the mulberry, previously white, was black.

Nutella Mouse Cups

Ingredients:

12

- ½ cup cream cheese, softened
- · ⅓ cup Nutella
- · 1/2 tablespoon vanilla extract
- · ⅔ cup heavy cream (or whipping cream)
- · 1 tablespoon granulated sugar
- · 1 tablespoon cocoa powder, unsweetened

Method:

- 1) In a large mixing bowl, use a hand mixer and beat the cream cheese until light and fluffy. Add Nutella and vanilla extract and continue to beat until everything is smooth, fully and blended together.
- 2) In a separate smaller mixing bowl, whip the cream using your hand mixer set on low-medium speed until you form soft peaks. Add the sugar and cocoa powder, set the mixer to high and continue to whip until you reach stiff peaks.
- 3) Gently fold the whipping cream mixture into the Nutella/cream cheese mixture until fully and combined with no streaks visible.
- 4) Transfer the mousse into individual sized serving cups. You can pipe them to make the transfer easier. At this stage, the mousse will be very soft. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours to let the mousse set. If you have time, leave it overnight.

Serve as is or top off the mouse with your favourite toppings such as whipped cream and shaved chocolate.

Country Stargazing Planetary Conjunctions

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA

Just as our daylight skies are ever-changing, with new sunsets and cloud formations, our evening skies are constantly changing too, as the star patterns move across the sky throughout the year. And amongst the stars are a few brighter ones that seem to wander on their own path. These are of course the planets of our solar system. The word planet means "wanderer", given by the ancient Greek's who studied the night sky and began to understand their orbits.

As the planets continue their never-ending path around the Sun, their orbits can sometimes bring the planets together forming incredible conjunctions, from our perspective here on earth.

Between the 22nd of February and 8th of March, head outside just after sunset and watch the planets in motion! Jupiter and Venus will approach each other before beginning to move further apart from our perspective! The Moon will even join in on the 22nd and 23rd! Jupiter and Venus Conjunction.

Adding to the spectacle, on 28th Feb, Mars makes a close approach to the Moon. Visible as a red star, Mars can be easily seen with the naked eye. Don't confuse Mars for the nearby Aldebaran and Betelgeuse stars however, as the three red objects and the Moon make a large triangle in the sky.

When to look: Just after sunset 22nd February to 2nd March

Which direction to look: Low to the western horizon for Jupiter and Venus. For the Moon and Mars, north north-west in the early evening.
