
15th Singles Awareness Day

Whatever your status this year remember to appreciate what you have and be careful what you wish for!



February Stargazing

Saturn and Venus Meet the Moon | 1st February





When and where to look:

Head outside at about 8pm and look to the western horizon.

Something Interesting:

Venus is the brightest planet we can see from Earth and it's about 450 degrees Celsius! It may not be a great place to visit, but thanks to our Sun's light reflecting off a thick layer of sulphuric cloud, it certainly makes for a spectacular sight in our evenings. Often called the "Evening Star", the sulphuric cloud that surrounds Venus makes a great reflection for our Sun's light. That's why it's so bright

Venus is at its Greatest Brilliance | 15th February

After the sun sets, Venus will make a striking sight setting on the western horizon. Tonight Venus is at what's know as its "greatest brilliance" and is the brightest it gets for the year. Through a telescope, Venus will appear as a crescent shape but its close to Earth at the moment and that's why it appears so bright.

From our position on Earth, Venus has phases just like our Moon. This is because Venus is inside Earth's orbit, so when it is closest to Earth, we can only see part of the surface of the planet that is illuminated by the Sun's light.



Something Interesting:

Ancient astronomers recognised that five "stars" moved quickly and predictably across the night sky. These stars were monitored and tracked and are now known as the five planets visible to the naked eye: Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn

When and where to look: From 7.30pm, 22nd February in the west.

Alpha Centaurids Meteor Shower | 8th February

The Alpha Centaurids Meteor Shower returns to WA's night sky from 28th January to 21th February, peaking on 8th February.

When and where to look:

The peak of the Alpha Centaurids Meteor Shower is from 11pm on 8th February. However, this year's Alpha Centaurids Meteor Shower peak coincides with a first quarter moon. Wait until after 2am on 9th February to reduce the impact from the moonlight. Look towards the south east and to the left of the Southern Cross.





Orion the Hunter is a famous summer constellation, and it is up in the early evening for you to see now. First thing in the evening, look directly to the east. The brightest star you'll see is Sirius.

Directly to the left of Sirius is what is often referred to as 'the Saucepan', and it's part of the Orion constellation. There are three bright stars in a reasonably straight line that make up the base of the saucepan, and a handle sticks out at the top right.

Orion has been known since ancient times. In Greek mythology, Orion is a mighty hunter, but his image is upside down in the southern hemisphere. The three bright stars of the base are Orion's belt, and the saucepan handle form Orion's sword.

Something Interesting

If you have a telescope, there's a beautiful object for you to find in Orion. The middle star of the handle of the 'Saucepan', is not just one star at all. When looked at through a telescope or powerful binoculars, the beautiful Orion nebula reveals itself. A nebula is a gaseous region in space where new stars are born. The Orion Nebula has about 700 baby stars that give the glow. It is approximately 1,400 light years from Earth and is a massive region of about 24 light years in diameter.

Starlink

Starlink, the satellite internet service launched by SpaceX, is on a mission to connect the entire globe!

Since its debut in 2019, this ambitious project has already sent over 7,000 satellites zipping around our planet, and it's aiming for the stars—literally—with plans to expand its fleet to nearly 12,000, and even a whopping 34,400 in the future!

By September 2024, Starlink had over 4 million subscribers, showing just how much people crave reliable internet

Watermelon—the perfect summer fruit

Facts:

- Wild watermelons are native to South Africa.
- There are more than 1,200 varieties of different watermelons.
- Although many people prefer not to, all of the watermelon including the rind can be eaten.
- There is evidence showing that the first watermelon ever grown was in Egypt approximately 5,000 years ago.
- Watermelon juice may relieve muscle tension.
- In 2013 the heaviest watermelon ever recorded weighed 350.5 lbs.

Growing Tips:

Water deep and regular.

If possible, for about 10 days before harvest stop watering or at least not as much. Excess water at this time may dilute the flavor and cause the melons to split.

When are they ripe?

The tap test—does it sound hollow?

The small tendrils around where the watermelon connects to the vine will be dry.

Teddy Bear Sunflowers

The 'Teddy Bear' sunflower is named for its cute, plush-like appearance. This sunflower variety grows to about two to three feet tall and boasts large, fluffy golden flowers.

These sunflowers bloom from mid-summer until the first frost, attracting bees,

butterflies, and birds. Both the petals and seeds are edible.

Peanut-Butter-and-Jam Heart Cookies

Peanut butter and jelly...but make it a cookie.

Prep Time: 45 mins

Total Time: 1 hr 15 mins

Yield: 2 dozen

Ingredients

1 ½ cups all-purpose our

1 ½ teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 stick unsalted butter, room temperature

½ cup granulated sugar

½ cup packed light-brown sugar

1 cup creamy peanut butter

1 large egg

⅓ cup raspberry jam, stirred to loosen



Directions

Step 1 Whisk together our, baking powder, and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Beat butter and sugars with a mixer on medium speed until pale and uffy. Beat in peanut butter, then egg. Reduce speed to low, and beat in our mixture until dough forms. If dough is sticky, refrigerate for 5 to 10 minutes.

Step 2

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Roll dough into 1 1/2-inch balls (about 2 tablespoons each). Arrange on parchment-lined baking sheets, spacing 1 1/2 inches apart. Press into 1 3/4-inch rounds. Press hearts into centers using your ngertips. Refrigerate for 20 minutes.

Step 3

Bake for 12 minutes. Remove from oven, and reshape hearts using your ngertips or the handle of a wooden spoon. Fill indentation of each with a generous 1/2 teaspoon jam to form a heart. Bake until cookies are rm, 6 to 7 minutes more.

Storage

Cookies can be stored at room temperature for up to 2 days.
