From the Desk of the CEO

June Council Meeting

Policies

4

Council reviewed its Credit Card Policy and adopted a new policy called "Risk Management". Only minor changes were proposed for the Credit Card policy and the Risk Management policy is a requirement that all local governments must have.

Differential Rates.

Differential rates were adopted by Council and a submission has been forwarded to the Department of Local Government for their approval.

Differential rates proposed for 23/24 have the same increase as other rates so there are no unforeseen issues that could be raised.

Delegation Review.

Once in each year Council is required to review its delegations that allow the Chief Executive Officer to make decision and carry on the business of Local Government without referral to Council. Delegations approved remain unchanged from last year.

Queens Jubilee Tree Planting

This project was finally completed in May with about 125 trees planted around the bypass. The trees are all looking nice and healthy apart from the cold snap we experienced over the last little bit which caused a little concern, and not just to the trees.

Bin Stickers

The Visitors Centre Staff recently spoke to me about bin stickers and the availability of these through Keep Australia Beautiful.

One idea was to have our tourist landmarks placed on bins around town. Depending on cost we woould like several different stickers made.

If anyone would like to submit a drawing that would be suitable as a bin sticker (240 Litre wheelie Bins) please do so.



The Bulga Downs Slot Car Rallies

In 1965 friends came to visit Jean and Frank Murray and John Lukis at Bulga Downs Station. Rita Castledine had been to St Marys with Jean and her husband Rob was a builder. (Rob went on to build the new homestead at Cashmere Downs in 1966). They hatched a plan to build their own slot car shed. Rob drafted up the measurements for the shed and they designed their own track.

Frank and John built the 9 x 3.6m shed and cemented the floor. They then built the 186 foot (56.7m) track by gluing 2 sheets of Masonite together and using a router to put in the slot and narrow drop downs on either side for the braiding. This was secured in place with a blowtorch soldering iron. The track included two chicanes (narrow sections where cars couldn't pass each other), a full circle where cars passed out of sight, and an S bend. The track ranged from 5cm to 2.1m high with sloping cants. The four lanes were coloured red, black, yellow and blue and had matching throttle hand pieces and chairs. They had to start the Lister engine for the power.

Jean wrote away to the oil companies and they acquired silk Castrol banners, posters, flags and metal signs to decorate the shed.

The Scalextric cars (bought in Perth) were either Open Wheelers or Custom Built with the scale of 1:24. They bought separate motors (33 000 rpm) and tyres (ranging from standard 5mm to big fat 10mm) and played around "hotting them up". With big tyres you had to be careful passing cars in the close lanes as you would be knocked off! The sedans were OK to bump with, as their tyres were covered.

Amongst their cars, John had his Ford LTD Yank Tank and a Lotus, Frank a Mustang and a Thunderbird and Jean a pink convertible with a fox tail on the aerial, and fur seat covers. They were about \$12 each.

It was the nickel boom and "the mineral boys" often played with the family. Friends like Lefroy's on their way home to Cashmere Downs from Sandstone, always called in and often played too.

In 1966 they held their first fundraiser rally, raising money for Kalgoorlie School of the Air P&C. No mean feat with 32 volt power and kerosene fridges. About 70 people would come from the surrounding district and Kalgoorlie for these exciting events. Frank's team was the Red and Whites including Rita Castledine, Joy Lefroy, and Tom Senior (Lake Mason Stn).

John's team were the Black and Whites, including Jean Murray, Rob Castledine, Phillip Lefroy and Sally Senior (Lake Mason Stn).

Jean made arm bands and caps for the racers, in red and white and black and white.


They tried to mix up the more experienced players and had officials spaced around the track to catch wayward cars and replace them. The pits were also kept very busy doing repairs from crashes (many cars were prepared earlier). They also had spare handpieces which could burn out from players going flat out, to being pulled out of the wall in the excitement!

There was often mayhem with players yelling that their car wasn't going anywhere, when it was actually someone else's car they were looking at, their car having crashed further up the track.

Going around the full circle was fraught with danger when they lost sight of the car and others were going around there too, hoping they would come out in the lead, or come out at all!

There were people racing in Kalgoorlie but no-one had a track like the one at Bulga. Frank and John's track was the second longest in Australia at the time and their record was only 14 seconds to complete the circuit.

There is a trophy from one of the Slot Car Rallies in the Sandstone Museum.

July 11th: International Town Criers Day



Stuffed Sweet potatoes with chipotle and lime yoghurt



Ingredients:

15

- 4 small to medium sweet potatoes
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- Freshly ground black peeper
- 1 cup plain Greek yogurt
- Half a teaspoon dried chipotle chili powder
- 1 tbsp fresh lime juice
- 1 cup cooked black beans (Drained and rinsed, if canned)
- 1 avocado, cubed
- 1 tbsp chopped coriander
- 2 tsp chopped fresh chives

Method:

- Preheat the oven to 200C and line a baking tray with a sheet of aluminum foil.
- Place the sweet potatoes on the tray and bake until fork-tender (40 to 45min).
- Remove from the oven. Slice the potatoes lengthwise into two halve. Fluff the flesh with a fork when still hot.
- Drizzle a tbsp of olive oil and a pinch of salte and pepper into each potato and mix well.
- For your yoghurt dressing, add chili powder and lime juice to your yoghurt and stir.
- To serve, add 2-3 tablespoons of black beans, one tablespoon of the cubed avocado, fresh coriander and chives on top of each sweet potatoe.
- Drizzle some chipotle-lime yoghurt and freshly ground black pepper to enjoy.






