From the Desk of the CEO

May's Council meeting saw the review and adoption of the following policies:

- Fitness for Work Policy,
- Debt Collection Policy,
- Financial Hardship Policy.

Minor changes have been made and these are available on Council's website.

Council also approved the excision of an area from the airport reserve for Horizon Power to allow a solar farm to be constructed.

This is in addition to the solar panels they have established alongside the power station in Griffith Street, making Sandstone more reliant of renewable power than diesel generation.

Prior to the Council meeting, Council had a preview of the draft 2023/2024 budget.

The Post Office Café is now open for business and the girls are doing a brilliant job. I can personally vouch for the "London Bridge Croissant" and the "Post Office Parcel".

The trees are finally in the ground around the By-Pass. Some 120 trees have been planted with lots of positive comments being received, which is always good.

The Works crew have relocated from the Sandstone - Paynes Find Road to complete some work on the Wiluna Road prior to relocating to the Meekatharra Road.

In June Richard Marver will be visiting to talk to our works supervisor about road rehydration and discuss options that are available for the Meekatharra Road. The long-term benefit amongst others is less road damage from flood waters, saving Council the cost of reinstatement.

Fill the eskies and get the barbie ready for WA Day on the 5th June.

Why are we celebrating WA Day? In April 2012, Foundation Day, the day that the first European settlers arrived in WA to found the Swan River colony on June 1st 1829, was formally changed to WA Day following bipartisan political support in the West Australian Parliament.

This welcomed in a new era for the State with WA Day being a universal celebration of all Western Australians, recognising our Aboriginal history, early European settlers and the many people from all over the world who have made, and continue to make, West Australian their home.

A bit of History

The Western part of Australia was claimed for Britain on May 2nd 1829 by Captain Fremantle. The merchant vessel Parmelia with civilian settlers on board arrived on the night of May 31st 1829 and sighted the coast on June 1st. The Swan River Colony was officially proclaimed on June 11th.

In 1832, Admiral Sir James Stirling, the administrator of Western Australia decided to establish an annual celebration to unite the new colony's inhabitants, including all settlers and Aborigines.

Stirling chose June 1st each year (or if on a Sunday, on the following Monday), the date of the first sighting. The holiday was originally called 'Foundation of the Colony Day', and later became simply 'Foundation Day'.

In 2012, the name was changed to Western Australia Day because Western Australia is a vast geographic area comprising many different urban, rural and regional communities, as well as being a very multicultural community, the emphasis for WA Day celebrations is on inclusion of all people no matter how long they have called themselves West Australians

Because of the celebration of Western Australia Day, Western Australia does not celebrate the King's birthday holiday in June, as do other Australian states.

<u>June</u>

So where did the name June for the 6th month on the Gregorian Calendar come from?

The month was named after Juno, the Roman goddess of childbirth and fertility. She is a chief goddess and female counterpart of Jupiter, and resembles closely to the Greek Goddess Hera.

Her name comes from the root word for "young" (Luuen) and goes back to the idea of vital energy and fertility.

She was connected with all aspects of the life of women, most particularly married life.

Her exact origin is unknown but she was one of the oldest Roman deities, one of the three original gods which are Jupiter, Juno and, Minerva, honoured on the Quirinal* (later on the Capitoline).

She was also known as Juno Sospita, the chief deity of a city located in Latium southeast of Rome called Lanuvium. She is often depicted wearing a goatskin, carrying a spear and shield, being the protector of one in confinement.

She was also known as Juno Lucina (light), the goddess of childbirth. Because the presence of a belt could hinder the delivery of a woman's child, no offering could be made at her temple unless all knots were untied.

She was also known as Juno Moneta, the protectress of funds. Her primary temple was built in the Arx, the northern part of Capitoline Hill. The temple was located next to the Roman mint hence the word money came from her name, Moneta.

Why do June and July have similar names?

July was originally called Quitilis which is the Roman word for 'fifth' because it was the fifth month of the Roman year. It was later changed to July by Julius Caesar, after his family name, Julius.

Life Hacks

- If your candles are burning too low to reach the wick, try lighting a piece of uncooked spaghetti which will reach into the deep candles.
- If you dropped an item and you can't find it, attach a nylon sock with a rubber band to the end of your vacuum cleaner. Turn on the vacuum cleaner and vacuum the area where you lost the item. The item will get caught on the sock.
- To easily know what key fits which lock, use nail polish to paint the keys, using a different colour for each key (back door, front door, garage,...). Nail polish is extremely durable and last longer than spray paint.
- If you need to fill a bucket that wont fit under the sink's faucet, use a pool noodle as an extension.
- Keep seeds fresh by storing them in an airtight container with a silica packet, the "Do not eat" sachets in food items, pill bottles,...
- Put car wax on your bathroom mirror to prevent it from fogging up. Apply a small amount to the mirror, let it dry and buff with a soft, dry cloth.

- Stuff an empty toilet paper tube with dryer lint and use it as a fire starter.
- Loop a zip tie around each side of your phone to make a telephone stand. Tighten the zip ties until they are snug to the phone with the zip-tie heads facing down and near the edge of your phone.
- Turn an empty tube of lip balm into a secret cash stash. Use a long nail or cotton swap to remove any wax residue.
- To remove paint from a carpet, pour denatured alcohol onto a rag and scrub away the paint. Colour can transfer from the rag to the carpet so use a rag that is closest to the rug's colour.
- Put old cut up sponges on the bottom of plant pots to prevent water from settling on the bottom and causing root rot.

P.S. Walking is even worse. Pedestrians don't even buy bicycles.



Orange Polenta Cakes

Ingredients:

17

- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1/2 cup polenta
- 1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil (see notes)
- 1/3 cup maple syrup, plus extra to serve
- 1 tbsp finely grated orange rind
- 1/3 cup orange juice
- 2 eggs
- 80g packet pistachio kernels
- 2 small oranges


Method:

- <u>Step 1:</u> Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan-forced. Grease a 12-hole (1/3-cup capacity) muffin pan.
- <u>Step2:</u> Place flour, polenta, oil, maple syrup, orange rind, orange juice, eggs and pistachios in a food processor. Process until pistachios are finely chopped and mixture is well combined. Divide mixture evenly amongst the holes in prepared pan.
- <u>Step 3:</u> Peel and thinly slice orange into rounds (you'll need 12 slices in total). Place 1 orange slice on top of each cake. Bake for 18 to 20 minute or until golden and just firm to touch. Stand for 2 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack lined with baking paper.

<u>Step 4:</u> Drizzle tops with extra maple syrup. Set aside to cool. Serve cakes warm or cold.
