From the Desk of the CEO

Hello to the residents of, and visitors to Sandstone.

Congratulations to everyone involved in the Art Exhibition and to Ramelius Resources for their sponsorship and for their attendance at the exhibition. It was a first for me and I was amazed at the talent in and around this community.

Projects nearing completion:

The Caravan Park units – completion has been delayed as we are trying to reach agreements on the effluent disposal requirements.

New Shire House – this house will be delivered on site on 30th September.

Oroya Street median strip renewal – the program has re-commenced with more trees being planted. Unfortunately, smaller plants and shrubs are not plentiful at present but should be as the summer approaches.

On another matter, there are always suggestions put forward about how best Shire facilities and services should be managed. Some suggestions are helpful and some are not. The Council sets Polices and programs and as the CEO, I am responsible to the Council to ensure that Policies are followed and programs are completed. The Brain's Amazing Ability of Visual Perception

As neurological research continues, it will only reveal more detailed questions to ask regarding every aspect of this incredibly designed structure.

Recently, researchers from the University of Sydney, University of Queensland, and University of Cambridge "have confirmed that human brains are naturally wired to perform advanced calculations, much like a high-powered computer, to make sense of the world through a process known as Bayesian inference."

Bayesian inference is a statistical method that combines prior knowledge with updated evidence to make an intelligent guess regarding a hypothesis. Put another way, it's a method to assess how new information influences the chances that a current belief (hypothesis) continues to be correct. For example, if a person knows what an airplane looks like and sees a flying metallic object with two wings, they might use their prior knowledge to guess it's an airplane.


The research team, led by Dr William Harrison, made the discovery by recording brain activity from volunteers while they passively viewed displays, engineered to elicit specific neural signals related to visual processing. They then devised mathematical models to compare a spectrum of competing hypotheses about how the human brain perceives vision.

In their formal paper in *Nature*, Harrison et al. said, "We found that the tuning of the human visual system is highly conditional on stimulus-specific variations in a way that is not predicted by previous proposals." Co-author of the *Nature* paper, Dr. Reuben Rideaux of the University of Sydney stated, "What makes this finding significant is the confirmation that our brains have an inherent design that allows this advanced form of processing, enabling us to interpret our surroundings more effectively."

Indeed, when evolution is mentioned in the *Nature* article, it is only in reference to timescales, "Sensory representations are thought to be tuned to behaviourally relevant statistics of natural environments over evolutionary and developmental timescales."

And, It is interesting to note that the sum of the tuning curves provides a relatively poor approximation of the statistics of constructed scenes, raising the possibility that the default tuning of sensory systems depends more on statistics accumulated over evolutionary time scales than developmental time scales.

There was no evolutionary description-detailed or otherwise-as to how the human brain processes visual information. This causes one to ask why the title of the University of Sydney's article is, "Evolution wired human brains to act like supercomputers"


September Stargazing

Anatres is a super giant red star and the 15th brightest star we see in the the Southern Hemisphere's night sky. On the night of September 10th, the Moon will pass in front of Antares and the view should be spectacular, especially when the action starts. From Perth, tje star will begin to be occulted by the Moon at 6:50pm on 10th September, and will reappear at 11.20pm. It should be easy to see the star disappear into the dark limb of the Moon, so start watching from 9pm to witness the full effect. You'll gradually see the Moon move closer to the star before blocking it from view completely. The reappearance may be a bit harder to see as the star will reemerge from the brighter side of the Moon. This will look great through telescopes and binoculars if you have access.




This is the month to view Saturn! On the 8th September, Saturn is at what is called "opposition" and means its closest to Earth for the year. If you head out under the stars at around 7:30pm on 17th September, you'll catch a glimpse of Saturn above the Moon in the east.

Scorpius, more commonly referred to as Scorpio, is a large constellation that actually looks like its namesake! Sometimes it's quite difficult to make out the shape of constellations, but you should have some success with Scorpius! It is visible all through spring during the early evenings. It lies overhead at around 8pm and is a lovely, large constellation. See if you can find the curve of Scorpio's body and the sting in its tail stretching up to the centre of the sky!

Make Smoking History is 'Worried About You'

Even though tobacco smoking rates are declining, tobacco use is still the largest cause of preventable death and disease in Australia. In a bid to prompt people who smoke to quit, Cancer Council WA's Make Smoking History Program will re-run the *Worried About You* campaign, across Western Australia.

This narrative campaign, produced by Gatecrasher, focuses on a daughter who is worried that her father will become ill from smoking. The television advertisement uses an emotive and powerful story to remind people who smoke to think about how their smoking affects their loved ones. Research commissioned by Make Smoking History found that a key motivator to help people quit smoking is to remind them how smoking impacts their relationships with the people who matter most.

The campaign will appear across various media channels including television, radio, audio streaming services, out-of-home, and digital platforms until Sunday 27 October 2024.

BAITS LAID FOR:

FOXES / WILD DOGS / FERAL PIGS

Please note that the majority of the land surrounding the Sandstone Town site and the areas between towns, is Station land owned by private individuals and is, therefore, private property.

Station owners are permitted, by law, to lay baits on their land to control predatory animals in order to protect their cattle / calves.

Please be aware that birds do pick up these baits and drop them close to the roads and within the town site.

It is in your best interests to keep your dogs on leashes at all times and to place muzzles (without tongue gaps) on your dogs while out and about to prevent accidental exposure to poisons.

5.8 RUBBISH BINS AND RUBBISH COLLECTIONS

COUNCIL MEETING HELD: 22 AUGUST 2024

DATE TO BE REVIEWED: AUGUST 2027

Objective:

17

To ensure consistency and equity of services to customers and ensure safe and healthy collection of rubbish services

The following guidelines will be used

- 1. The Shire of Sandstone provides and owns all bins collected within the townsite of Sandstone.
- 2. Damaged bins will be replaced by the Shire only if the Shire caused the damage.
- 3. Stolen rubbish bins will be replaced by the Shire if the theft has been reported to Police.
- 4. Replacement of bins not damaged by the shire will be charged at cost to the ratepayer.
- Domestic bins will be collected on Mondays each week (or the next working day during holiday periods).
- Commercial bins will be collected Monday (as above) and Thursdays.
- 7. Councils Fees and Charges will reflect the cost of a twice-a-week commercial pickup.
- The Shire provides bin liners which must be used and must be tied closed by the resident ready for pickup.
- 9. Failure to tie up the bin liner may result in your bin not being picked up.
- Heavy materials such as bricks, concrete pieces, sand etc causing excess weight, will not be taken if the truck hoist can't lift the bin.
- Bins containing liquid waste products (paints, oils, flammable liquids) may incur an additional cost for special pick up or be refused pick up.
- 12. The Shire will provide stickers for bins with these instructions.

Please take special note of Point 8 as failure to tie up your bag may result in your bin not being emptied.

PIZZA DOUGH

Ingredients

19

- 600g (4 cups) bread flour or pizza flour (or plain/all purpose)
- 2 tsp (6g) rapid rise or instant yeast
- 2.5 tsp (15g) salt , kosher / cooking salt
- 4 tsp (20g) white sugar
- 4 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 330 ml (1 1/3 cups) warm tap water
- Pizza sauce, cheese and toppings of choice (pineapple?)
- Extra flour and oil for working



Instructions:

- 1 Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl with a wooden spoon. Flour, yeast, sugar, salt
- 2 Add wet ingredients into a well in the centre of bowl. Oil, water.
- 3 Mix together so it comes away from the side of the bowl

4 - Sprinkle extra flour into surface and Knead dough for 5 minutes. Shape into a ball.

5 - Drizzle bowl with olive oil and place dough ball in, rub with oil. Cover with cling wrap and put in a warm place to rise for 1-2 hours until it doubles in size.

(optional: refrigerate for up to 5 days)

6 - Scrape dough out of bowl onto a lightly floured surface and shape into a log.

7 - Cut into 3 equal portions (this recipe makes 3 bases) and form each into balls tucking the edges under it so you have a smooth surface.

8 - Place balls onto tray and sprinkle with a touch of flour covering surface so they don't stick to tea towel; cover with a damp tea towel and leave in a warm place to **rise again** - 1 hour until almost double in size.

9 - Get toppings ready and Preheat oven to 275 degrees Celsius

10 - Stretch and shape: Sprinkle a work surface and place one ball on top. Without touching the edges use finger tips and back of fingers to deflate dough gently and spread out into 20cm round; then use fingers and palms to stretch the dough working around the circle until almost 30cm. transfer to a pan and finish stretching and shaping neatly.

11 - Working fast—Spread pizza sauce, cheese and toppings of choice.

12 - Bake 10 minutes, rotating at 4 minutes and checking at 8 minutes until cheese is melted and golden.





Repeat process to make 2 more pizzas.

Notes:

<u>Flour</u>: all purpose flour works fine but bread flour/ pizza flour is even better! <u>Yeast</u>: use yeast labelled instant or rapid rise. If using normal 'active dry yeast' then dissolve yeast with sugar in the warm water and add with wet ingredients. <u>Salt</u>: reduce salt to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp if using table salt

<u>Water temp</u>: if scorching hot it will kill the yeast. Think lovely bath temp water. <u>Rising</u>: time will vary depending on temperature and humidity of room.

Step 10:



<u>Cheese</u>: try to use fresh grated as it is lighter and doesn't weight down the dough like store brought shredded cheese which can also be coated in anti-caking agents that don't melt as well.

<u>Toppings</u>: avoid using too many toppings on home made pizza dough like this; it will weigh down the dough and become soggy. <u>Cook immediately</u>: once you finish stretching the pizza base transfer to a pan, top and cook straight away! Leaving it sitting for even a short time can make it 'sweat underneath which equals a soggy base.



Household Electricity Credit

The State and Commonwealth Government jointly announced that eligible Western Australian households will receive a \$700 payment to ease cost of living pressures. Long term or permanent residents who are supplied with electricity through an embedded network or sub-metering arrangement may be eligible for the credit through RevenueWA.
