From the Desk of the CEO

Greetings to the residents of and visitors to Sandstone.

I wish everyone a happy, healthy and prosperous 2025.

The Shire's auditors completed their work late in December and I am pleased to say that the final report was pleasing with only a couple of minor issues that needed correction. These reports go through the Ministers office and having a good report helps towards ensuring the stability, viability and hopefully ensure the longevity of this local government.

Voting in 2025:

I have noted that according to the 2021 census, the Shire's population is 107 people. The *My Council* website says our population is 78 and people in the Shire are of voting age.

But we have only 55 registered voters and if we used the lowest population estimate, there are at least 23 people in the Shire who are not registered to vote. I understand that some people may not be eligible to vote for various reasons. However having as many registered voters as possible also contributes to relevance and longevity of the Shire as its own entity.

Therefore if you are eligible to enroll to vote, I encourage you to do so especially with Local, State and Federal elections due in 2025.

I am pleased to advise that Deputy CEO Tracey Weiss has decided to stay on in her position with the Shire. Tracey is an integral part of the Shire management team.

In 2025 it is planned to carry out some work on the town roads, bitumen sealing around the median strips to cover water damage, increase the café parking area and sealing the carpark at the community centre. We have received funding for this work and its timing will depend on when we can get a contractor to town to complete the works.

We also have some funding to install some new children's play equipment at the Community Centre and Lefroy Park and possibly the Caravan Park.

The **new website** is now live and many thanks to Tegan Brown for bringing this project to its conclusion. The site is fully revived, much brighter, interactive and easy to search.

A new government regulation requires local governments to record Council Meetings and make them available on their websites. This takes effect from 1st January 2025. It will provide an opportunity for many interested persons to go to the website and listen to Council decision making processes.





January Stargazing



On these beautiful nights, take the time to be outside after sunset to see a stunning view of Venus and Saturn close to the crescent Moon. If you keep watching the pair over the coming fortnight, you'll see the planets appear very close to each other on 18th January.

When to look: After sunset, 3rd and 4th January

Which direction to look: West

Something Interesting:


Saturn's rings are enormous — great rings of

dust, ice, and rock stretching almost 300,000km from the gas giant — but they're also surprisingly thin in places. Because of a quirk of how the rings orbit Saturn's equator, on a tilt with the planet, every few years the rings appear to disappear because from our viewpoint on Earth we're seeing them edge-on. Then, slowly but surely, over a course of months they come back into view again.

Orion the Hunter is a famous summer constellation, and it is up in the early evening for you to see now. First thing in the evening, look directly to the east. The brightest star you'll see is Sirius. Directly to the left of Sirius is what is often referred to as 'the Saucepan', and it's part of the Orion constellation. There are three bright stars in a reasonably straight line that make up the base of the saucepan, and a handle sticks out at the top right. Orion has been known since ancient times. In Greek mythology, Orion is a mighty hunter, but his image is upside down in the southern hemisphere. The three bright stars of the base are Orion's belt, and the saucepan handle form Orion's sword. With lovely summer evenings ahead, take an opportunity to marvel at the incredible constellation of Orion.

When to look: Early to late evening Which direction to look: East





Have you noticed Mars rising in the east yet? It rises after 8pm and the red planet is at its brilliant best this month because it will be close to Earth.

Every 26 months, Mars is at "opposition". What this means is that Mars is as close to Earth it gets during the 26 months and appears brighter in our night sky. Why every 26 months? The key to understanding this is to know that Earth goes around the Sun faster than Mars and it takes 26 months for us to catch up and be close together again!

Mars is as close as it gets to Earth all year and it won't be close again until February 2027. This year, Mars has its closest approach to Earth on 12th January and the red planet will be at opposition on the 16th.

The distance between Earth and Mars varies when we catch up to each other in orbit. That's because we both have elliptical (or oval shaped) orbits around the Sun. Sometimes we're closer to each other than other times. The last time Mars was particularly close was in 2020. It's not until 2033 that it will be that close again.

have endeavorued to take followers of The Dolly Pot for a stroll around and in Black Range township (Nungarra) during the year 1906 (33 years ago). In doing so I sincerely trust that most of those whose names I mention are still on the surface, and that Dame Fortune has been kind to them through the years. To them I pen a "ery hearty and sincere cheerio."

The time is early November—hot and dry. On Howie's Patch, about 1½ miles south-west of the town, we meet Tom Sampey and Alec Quinn working the Golden Acre; next to them are Jim O'Donnell and Bill Andersen (a Swede), while a little south of the claims named is Morris Solomon (of "Solomons Solution" fame) engaged on a huge white quartz reef. Leaving them on our way through the mulga scrub to the township, Tom McHarry and Alf. Holmes are seen cooking the midday meal, the while having a breezy chat.

The first building we encounter hitting the town is Cobb and Co.'s coach exchange and fodder premises. Matthews, Charlie Chick or Mick Ridge is met with, and Magnet or Lawlers news is eagerly sought. Across the street Bill Pearce's boarding house is busy catering well for the inner man, while Don Hay and Ike Wallace are seeing to the orders placed with their bottling works. At the post office we are handed our mail in true goldfields fashion by Jack Kenny, Syd Pound, Billy Cock, or Albert Gare, and then a visit is paid to the photographic studies of Amos Flegeltaub and Jim O'Malley, who did excellent work in those days. Wrensteds, the chemist, we next call upon, and here we have dispensed the best of mixtures (he says "I drink 'em myself, so they must be Over to Bob Leslie's bakery, where we purchase a loaf of bran bread for a bob (and damned glad to get it, too), and then into Jimmy Donnellan's store for a couple of tins of "dog." Bestore for a couple of tins of "dog." Before going further north we drop into Alf. Foden's hairdressing and billiard saloon, where there are gathered sports of the town perusing newspapers spread over the billiard tables and where, whilst reading is going on, "Woodsie," the "Toe-bighter King," is "practising

his "art," which results in many heated

words-and toes.

Next door is Billy Cock's big general store, which supplies prospectors and miners engaged over a very wide area. we observe Jack Kenny, Albert Gare and Billy Sampey going for their lives behind the counter packing orders On to for their delivery carts. W.A. Bank, of which the jovial and capable Chris. Lowry is manager, assisted by George Barrow. Chris. is the right man in the right place, while on Sunday he gives a hand to carry "dead meat" off the football field, where the Reefers meet the Towns. Just over the road Jim McNamara is O.I.C. of the police station, attached to which are Bert Sampson, Chris. McArthur (afterwards in charge), Bill Overend and Jim What-A little chin wagging here, and we reset Dick Roe in the courthouse premises. Being thirsty, we go straight into the front bar of Arthur Mose's Black Range Hotel and quickly sink a few pots, then going in and making a purchase at J. W. D. Robinson's fine drapery store (Robbie, the Draper's, as it is popularly known). Round the corner we go casually along to Billy Fairchild's cordial factory, where Bill and Bob Kelly (the carrier) are arguing the point on the quality of drink (but not that produced by William). Coming towards the main street again we contact the famous J. A. McDonald (famed for his enthusiasm for rifle shooting), shows us a new Westley-Richards rifle which has just arrived by coach for him, and he then tells us he has to "make a box for a fellow who was killed at Ber-

rigan, 68 miles north of the Range. To the Bank of Australasia to have a varn to Cruickshank and Hill about solo whist or bridge and then we see Dr. Nutting ride by on his white charger. Near by George Pile is busily engaged making a tank (and a splendid plumber he is). Billy Martin is standing at the front door of his Club Hotel and invites us to "try one." It has just arrived by team. We "try" one; we "try" another and then we have several.

Lurching across the street we listen to Harry Lauder singing "I Love a Lassie," "Stop Your Ticklin', Jock," and several others on Jim Spence's gramophone. Thence we go into Frank Evan's bike shop, where Frank and his youthful assistant are relating to a number of listeners how they have struck an Eldorado, but not a word as to locality. To stretch our "ham and eggs" (legs) we stroll quietly to Jack Stephenson's general store and here, too, we are well served

by the genial old proprietor himself, his able assistants being Clayton Crawford and Tom Keegan, and after learning what the road is like between Hog Well and White Well (on the Black Range-Magnet-road) we find our way to Palace Hotel, the splendid house so well conducted by the bold John McManaway. Having quenched our thirst we have a yarn to Charlie Wight at his produce store over the way. A visit to Mahoney's (Frank Turney. manager)

store next to the Palace satisfies our needs. From here O. V. Briner is seen sorting out his cases and "dissing" type in preparation of establishing "The Black Range Courier," which was destined to serve the district splendidly for several years.

As we enter Eli Jonas's hairdresser's shop we hear Eli loudly proclaim that "Poseidon will not win the Cup" (which he did, of course). In Dave Knott's butcher's shop there is excitement, as Doc. Clarson has just informed Dave that his (Clarson's) home has been burnt to the ground.

Finally we will call on Sam Jeavons, the town's only solicitor, for advice concerning matters legal and otherwise and then have a couple with him at Arthur Mose's pub before we go home.

I hope the old-timers of the Range have travelled with me up and down and across Gregory-street, Nungarra, away back 33 years ago.

Oh well, we have already started a list of places to return to and Sandstone is on that list (along with Westonia). "My impression of Sandstone (when we visited and stayed on 21st November) was that it is a neat, tidy, community minded, colourful, historical and interesting town. Additionally it is a finalist in three categories for the 2024 Tidy Towns awards (1. Overall State Award, 2. Litter Action & 3. Environmental Sustainability), which was obvious as I walked around each and every street of this spotless, remote town. The Shire of Sandstone produces a comprehensive 40-page "Bush Telegraph" community newsletter, complete with recipes, puzzles, craft, medical, emergency & pet information, advertising for local businesses, dates of interest, stargazing information and some "funnies" (to name a few), which they should be very proud of, especially considering the population is only 109 people with a median age of 60 years, mostly servicing surrounding pastoral leases and a stop for 4WD explorers and other travelers. We mainly wanted to stop in Sandstone to visit the popular London Bridge, which is part of a larger rock formation about 800 metres long and varying in height between 3 & 10 metres. The weathered basalt ridge is thought to be about 350 million years old and the "bridge" is the result of different rates of erosion in hard & soft rock. Unfortunately "London Bridge" is falling down, progressively growing thinner and thinner. Sadly, because of the road closures of all dirt roads, we weren't able to visit London Bridge, so a photo will have to suffice. We weren't in a hurry to leave Sandstone, so we visited the Post & Telegraph Office Cafe for breakfast and also to enjoy the small museum there as well and were on the road by about 9.30. "

Please note that the majority of the land surrounding the Sandstone Town site and the areas between towns, is Station land owned by private individuals and is, therefore, private property.


Station owners are permitted, by law, to lay baits on their land to control predatory animals in order to protect their cattle / calves.





Zucchini Match-making in Sandstone

My Zucchini plants grew amazingly. Just about every seed sprouted and became very healthy looking plants with big Green leaves and lots of flowers ... however...! did not get any zucchini!

As most garden enthusiast in Sandstone know, if you plan on growing zucchini you will probably have to pollinate it yourself!

Become a matchmaker by taking some pollen from the male flower and giving it to the female flower.

Sometimes we can rely on the ants in the area but like many, I had to get out there with a spare paintbrush and create some zucchini art.

I was enjoying making the stuffed zucchini flowers (absolutely delicious) but was glad to see something bigger after giving the plants a helping hand.

There's been awesome zucchini from lots of people over the last couple months including some massive ones from Jaimie—This picture shows one of his turned into schnitzels!

Make these just as you would a chicken snitty. Flour, egg, crumbs and whatever spices you like. I use S&P, onion powder, garlic powder and paprika.

Lemon Salmon Bake

Ingredients

serves 4

305g (1 ½ cups) dried risoni pasta
500ml (2 cups) chicken or vegetable stock
160ml (2/3 cup) pouring cream
1 teaspoon finely grated lemon rind
4 x 200g skinless salmon portions
2 zucchini, trimmed, peeled into ribbons
1 bunch asparagus, trimmed, halved
150g (1 cup) frozen peas, slightly thawed
2 green shallots, thinly sliced
Fresh mint leaves, to serve
Lemon slices, to serve



Method

Preheat oven to 190C/170C fan forced. Spread the risoni evenly over the base of a 5cm-deep, 20 x 30cm baking dish. Add the stock, cream and lemon rind and stir to combine. Cover tightly with foil and bake for 20 minutes.


Heat a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook the salmon, top side down, for 2 minutes or until golden. Transfer to a plate. Set aside.

Carefully remove the foil from the baking dish (beware of steam escaping). Stir the risoni and place the salmon, cooked side up, on top, pressing gently into the risoni. Arrange the zucchini, asparagus and peas around the salmon. Cook, uncovered, for 10 minutes or until the vegetables are tender. Set aside for 5 minutes to rest.

Scatter with the shallot and mint leaves and serve with lemon slices.

(*for a healthy option try using Greek yoghurt instead of cream)

What's Priority Assistance?

Priority Assistance is a priority fault repair and connection service we offer customers who depend on a working home phone due to a life-threatening medical condition. If you or someone living with you may be at risk without access to a working home phone, you could be eligible for Priority Assistance. Read our <u>Priority Assistance Policy (PDF, 135KB)</u> for more information.

Who's eligible?

If you or someone who's living at the same address has a diagnosed lifethreatening medical condition and relies on a fixed home phone service you may be eligible for Priority Assistance.

If you're not a current Telstra account holder, you'll need to order a new home phone service to receive Priority Assistance. Call us on 13 22 00 and say 'Priority Assistance' to place your order.

Examples of eligible medical conditions or circumstances include:

- At high risk of respiratory emergencies
- At high risk of cardiovascular emergencies
- At risk of life-threatening hypoglycaemia or epilepsy
- At high risk of obstetric and neonatal emergencies
- At high-risk with mental health disorders
- Technology-dependent who are at high risk.

You're also eligible for Priority Assistance if you have other dependent medical conditions and live alone without support or in a remote location.






